4. The Chief Engineers/Head of offices are requested to ensure that the above office procedure with regard to submission of files is followed without fail in future.

AMENDMENT No. 2/99

REGULATIONS—Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations—Regulation 16-A of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulation Amendment—Issued.

(Per.) B.P. (FB) No. 31

Proceedings :

The Government of Tamil Nadu in G.O. Ms. No. 144 P&AR (S) Department dated 17—6—98 have issued amendment to Rule 41-A of Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Service Rules in respect of acceptance of resignation of the Government Servant.

2. The existing Regulations 16-A of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations are corresponding to Rule 41-A of Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Service Rules. Now the Board has decided that the amendment issued by the Government in G.O. dated 17—6—98 shall be adopted and the existing provision of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulation 16-A be amended suitably.

3. Accordingly, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 79 (c) of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948 (Central Act 54 of 1948), the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby makes the following amendment to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulation :—

AMENDMENT

In the said Regulations, for Regulation 16-A, the following Regulation shall be substituted namely :—

16-A Acceptance of resignation :—

- (a) A Board Employee may resign his appointment by giving notice of not less than three months in writing direct to the appointing authority with a copy marked to his immediate superior officer. The period of three months notice shall be reckoned from the date of receipt of such notice by the appointing authority.
- (b) The Board Employee may withdraw the notice of his resignation before its acceptance. Withdrawal of resignation will not be permitted after its acceptance by the appointing authority.
- (c) The appointing authority shall issue orders on the notice of resignation before the date of expiry of notice, either accepting the resignation from a date not later than the date of expiry of the notice or rejecting the same, giving the reasons therefor. If no such order is passed, the resignation shall be deemed to have been accepted on the expiry of the period of notice.
- (d) Notice of resignation given by the Board Employee shall be accepted by the appointing authority, subject to the conditions :—

- (i) that no disciplinary proceeding is contemplated or pending against the Board Employee concerned under sub-regulation (b) of Regulation 8 of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Employees' (Disciplinary and Appeal) Regulations;
- (ii) that reports from the Directorate of Vigilance and Anti Corruption/Vigilance Cell of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board have been obtained to the effect that no enquiry is contemplated or pending against the Board Employee concerned;
- (iii) that no dues are pending to be recovered by the Board from the Board Employee concerned;
- (iv) that there is no contractual obligation of any kind including contractual obligation to serve the Board during the period in which the Board Employee concerned seeks to resign;
- (e) Notwithstanding anything contained in Clauses (i) and (ii) sub-regulation (d), where a Board Employee, under suspension or against whom disciplinary or criminal action or Vigilance enquiry is pending, seeks to resign, the appointing authority shall examine the nature and gravity of the case and may accept the resignation, if the case is not such as would warrant rejection of the notice of resignation".

In pursuance of the terms of settlement entered into with Unions on 31—12—93/19—1—94, Orders were issued in the reference first cited on revision of wages, rates of allowances and revision of work norms and staff pattern. Among other things, orders have been issued in Part-III under Annexure-II to the said B.P. revising the number of services to be assessed by an Assessor with effective from 1—12—92 and the norms to be adopted during 1996.

2. During 6/96, certain Unions brought to the notice of the Board that certain Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles have started implementing the revised norms to the Assessor prescribed to be implemented during 1996 as per B.P. (FB) No. 5 dated 25—1—94 before the matter is settled with Unions and issue of order for the effective date of implementation and requested the Board to issue order for deferring the implementation. Conceding the request of the Unions, the Board issued orders in Board's Memo. No. 28876/C1/95-3, dated 7—8—96 to defer the implementation of the revised norms until further orders and that the norms prescribed to Assessor with effect from 1—12—92 might be continued to be adopted. Inspite of that, it was reported that some of the Superintending Engineers are restricting the claims of Assessors for pro-rata wages based on the norms prescribed as "to be adopted during 1996" and insisting the Assessors to attend the assessment work as per the increased norms and that some of the Superintending Engineers are sanctioning the pro-rata wages to the Assessors based on the old norms effective from 1—12—92. The matter was discussed with the Unions and it was decided to issue suitable orders for the effective date of implementation of the enhanced norms indicated in the B.P. first cited as "to be adopted during 1996".

3. After careful consideration, it is hereby ordered that the enhanced norms for Semi-urban, Rural and Hill areas prescribed in (Per) B.P. (FB) No. 5 (SB) dt. 25—1—94 as "to be adopted during 1996" shall be adopted with effect from 1—1—1997 for sanction of posts in Assessment cadre. It is also ordered that avethough the posts are sanctioned by adopting the enhanced norms from 1—1—1997, the Assessors shall be permitted to claim pro-rata wages for the excess over yard-stick based on the old norms fixed from 1—12—92, upto 31—3—99.

4. The Superintending Engineers of all Distribution Circles shall verify whether the payment of pro-rata wages to Assessors were paid as ordered in para-3 above in their Circles, during the period upto 31—3—99. In Circles where there was any deviation, the concerned Superintending Engineers shall take corrective action.

5. The Superintending Engineers of all Distribution Circles shall implement the enhanced norms strictly with effect from 1—4—99 both for the Assessment work and for payment of pro-rata wages uniformly.

Appeal under clause 15 of the Letters Patent against the Order of the Honourable Mr. Justice P. Sathasivam dated 17—2—1997 and made in the exercise of the Special Original jurisdiction of the High Court in Writ Petition No. 8512 of 1991 presented under Article 226 of the Constitution of India to issue a Writ of Mandamus directing the respondents to give promotion to the petitioner to the post of fitter Grade II with reference to the promotion of his Juniors and grant monetary benefits from the eligible date.

ORDER :—This Writ Appeal coming on for hearing on this day Upon perusing the Grounds of Appeal, the Order of the Honourable Mr. Justice P. Sathasivam dated 17—2—1997 and made in the exercise of the Special Original Jurisdiction of the High Court in Writ Petition No. 8512 of 1991 and upon hearing the arguments of Mr. P. M. Bhaskaran Advocate for the Appellant, and of Mr. A. N. Sivaprakasam Standing Counsel on behalf of the respondents 1 to 3 and notice to respondents 4 and 5 not having been relieved either served or unpassed, the Court made the following Order :—

JUDGEMENT

(Judgement of the Court was Delivered by C. SHIVAPPA, J.)

This appeal is directed against the order of the learned single Judge dated 17—2—1997 passed in W.P. No. 8512 of 1991. The appellant herein sought for a direction to give promotion to him to the post of Fitter Grade II from the date when his juniors Messrs. R. Ranganathan, C. Chittibabu and K. Unnikrishnan were promoted with consequential monetary benefits.

2. The question for consideration is whether the appellant is entitled for promotion from the date when Messrs. Ranganathan, Chittibabu and Unnikrishnan were promoted?

3. The petitioner joined as a Temporary Casual Labourer in the Third Respondent's Circle, and he was promoted as Helper in the year 1977 along with respondents 4 and 5. Due to bifurcation of General Construction Circle, Katpadi, the services of Ranganathan, Chittibabu and Unnikrishnan were allotted to General Construction Circle at Madras, whereas, the appellant remained in General Construction Circle at Katpadi. During the relevant time, no promotions were given to the employees of Regular Work establishment category of the Katpadi Circle. Whereas, in the General Construction Circle at Madras, since the vacancies arose, the persons referred to above were promoted. Subsequently, the General Construction Circle, Katpadi got merged with General Construction Circle, Madras. At the time when the promotions were given, Circle-wise seniority list was maintained. There were vacancies in the General Construction Circle at Madras. In that fact situation, the case of those three persons were considered and they were promoted. Though subsequently both the circles were merged and a common seniority was maintained, since the appellant was not eligible for promotion, his case was not considered, as contended in the counter by the respondents. But, however, the fact remains that at present he is working as Fitter—Grade-II and he has been subsequently promoted.

4. When those three persons were promoted, what was relevant was the circlewise seniority. Their case was considered because there were vacancies and they were also eligible. Since the appellant was altogether on a different circle, in that circle since there were no vacancies, his case was not considered.

5. Promotion to higher posts depends on several criteria, such as, qualification, suitability, availability of vacancies in the concerned Circle, etc. In addition to the fact that the appellant belonged to a different circle at the relevant time, and what was governing was the circlewise seniority, there was also a Civil suit pending in O.S. No. 1639 of 1982 before the District Munsif, Katpadi, in which, there was a prohibitory order. These circumstances weighed with the authority for non-consideration of the case of the appellant.

6. Therefore, the non-consideration of the claim of the appellant for promotion along with the other three persons, was not in any way discriminatory or arbitrary. We see no infirmity in the reasoning of the learned single Judge. The writ appeal is, therefore, dismissed. Parties to bear their own costs.

In the Memorandum first cited, the following instructions have been issued :—

(a) Officers who write Confidential reports on their subordinates do not by and large, seem to realise the importance of this work. They satisfy themselves either with recording some routine, vague and colourless remarks or record remarks which are positively false and misleading. Cases have arisen where even after an Officer sends a report complaining about the work and conduct of a subordinate, he makes no mention of it while writing the Confidential Report. Similarly even when recorded facts are available in the Office about the work and conduct of a subordinate as for example, disciplinary cases, Vigilance reports, frequent absence from duty for one reason or another etc. these are not seen and taken into account in writing the Confidential Reports.

(b) There have been occasions where Officers who are by common consent either mediocre or below average or of questionable integrity have come to be promoted to higher post merely for the reason that the Board could not over look them on the basis of their Personal files, since there was nothing adverse about them in the Personal file. Grave damage has been caused to the administration by such promotions.

(c) It is expected that Officers who write their remarks on the work and conduct of their subordinates shall realise the responsibility entrusted with them and act in a manner befitting the trust placed in them. Whenever a Confidential report is put up to a Reporting/Scrutinising Officer, the Office concerned should also put up a brief note with reference to the records available in the Office touching on the work and Conduct of the Officer, so that these aspects are not lost sight of. If no such records are available that fact should also be specifically noted by the Office while putting up the papers to the Officer concerned.

2. Already there is a provision in item 15 (a) of the Performance Assessment Report format to record the punishments if any awarded to the employees during the period under report, and that copies of those Orders have to be kept in the Personal file.

3. While writing the Performance Assessment Report, the reporting Officer should take into account the following factors also :—

- (i) The integrity of the Official.
- (ii) Receipt of any Board or Chairman Medal.
- (iii) Involved in any Sexual harassment.
- (iv) Aided or assisted to save Board's Money or property.

4. All the Chief Engineers/Superintending Engineers and all Branches are requested to ensure that the instructions reiterated above are observed strictly.

As per provisions in para 5.19 of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Office Manual, at the top of left hand side of each sheet of the Note file, the current No. of the file to which the note file relates and the name of the section should be written.

2. Apart from the above, instructions have been issued from time to time to ensure that the Office procedures under the "Tottenham System" with regard to submission of files to the Officers of the Board should be followed without fail. In spite of repeated instructions and special training imparted to the staff of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, the "Tottenham System" is not being followed scrupulously. It is also noted that most of the files submitted to the Chairman are found to be in untidy condition without observing the above instructions and provisions in the Office Manual. Therefore, it is imperative to bring procedural changes to ensure proper adherence to the "Tottenham System".

AN EXTRACT OF PARA 12 OF THE JUDGEMENT DATED 04.03.99

The learned senior counsel for the respondents referred to a decision of D. Raju J. (as His Lordship then was) in W.P. No. 14792 of 1990 wherein the learned Judge by judgement dt. 8.7.1992 held that the subsequent to promotion to the petitioner it was not necessary to go into the various claims made by the petitioner therein. I am of the view, the petitioners are not eligible for promotion before the expiry of 3 years from the date of relinquishment of their right of consideration for promotion and after the expiry of the period of relinquishment it is stated that the cases of the petitioners were considered and they were promoted subsequently. In my view the decision of D. Raju J. (as His Lordship then was) would equally apply to the facts of the case. I do not find any infirmity in the order of the respondent Board in holding that it is not open to the petitioners to go back from their temporary relinquishment and claim that their case should be considered for notional promotion and it is also not open to them to seek to revoke the relinquishment already exercised by them before the expiry of the period of relinquishment. The writ petition fails and accordingly, it is dismissed. Rule Nisi is discharged. In the circumstances there will be no order as to costs.

In the Government Order first cited, Government have issued Orders setting up a separate Fund, namely "Kargil Defence Personnel Relief Fund" to help the Defence Personnel and their families. The Honourable Chief Minister has appealed for liberal donations to the Fund.

2. In their joint letter dated 3—7—99, the recognised Unions, Centrally affiliated Unions representing Workmen and Officers Associations of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board have expressed the willingness of their members to contribute one day salary to the Relief Fund. The Unions have also represented that pending recovery from the salary, the amount representing one day salary may be arranged to be remitted by the Board. Accordingly, pending actual recovery of the amount from the employees, a sum of Rs. 2.30 Crores has been drawn from the funds of the Board and remitted to the Relief Fund. Subject : Evaluation of Tender Bids, Discount and Exchange Rates to be adopted.

With reference to Ministry of Finance (Department of Economic Affairs) Office Memorandum No. 4 (5) FEB. I/88 dated 28—12—88 on the subject cited above, the undersigned is directed to state that the discount rates for foreign currencies are notified by this Department every quarter for enabling the procuring agencies to determine the real benefit (or grant element) in credit offers. The rates circulated were based on a formula adopted by OECD taking into account the periodical changes in the domestic interest rates in various currencies as reflected by the Commercial Interest Reference Rates (CIRR). This provided weightages to the uniform discounting rates of 10% and CIRR in the ratio 25, 75.

2. In 1992, the OECD changed their procedure, and the formula followed by DEA, for calculating the Differential Discount rates was as follows :—

- (i) Where the average CIRR of a currency during the preceding 6 month is less than 10% the discounting rate is calculated by taking average CIRR plus 25% of the differential between that rate and 10%. For example, if the average was 9%, the corresponding discounting rate for the currency would be $9\% + 25\% (10 - 9) = 9.25$.
- (ii) Where the average CIRR during the preceding 6 months is 10% or more, the discounting rate would be equal to the average CIRR.

3. The above formula no longer reflects OECD practice, which changed in September, 94 and again in September, 1996. The September, 1996 change reflects the full transition to a market based set of rates, or movement away from a uniform 10% DDR to a more "market oriented" rate which better reflects the underlying costs of funds. It was considered by the OECD that such rates more accurately reflected the concessionally level of tied loans.

4. Accordingly, it has been decided that the Department of Economic Affairs will notify the Differential Discounting Rates for major currencies based on the revised formula as describe below. The Differential Discount rates are to be calculated as follows :

$$\text{DDR} = \text{CIRR}^*$$

CIRR* is the average of CIRR of each currency for the previous six months.

5. The procedure for conversion of foreign currency bids will, however, remain unchanged. Such conversion of foreign currencies into rupees is to be done taking into account the BC selling rate of State Bank of India on the date of opening of price bids.

6. In all cases, the notified discount rate prevailing on the date of opening the price bids will be taken into account for purposes of evaluation of credit packages.

7. A table giving the Differential Discounting Rates for major currencies for the quarter January—March, 1997 is attached herewith.

8. Further, it has also been decided that the option to ask for credit package in tender notices should be left entirely to the PSUs (Public Sector Undertakings) i.e., it should not be mandatory. However, if credit packages are available and these are beneficial to the PSUs, they

should be availed. In case a PSU opts to ask for credit packages, then in the interests of transparency this should be intimated in the tender notices so that bidders are aware of this fact before tendering their bids.

Sub : Maximum inventory level to be maintained for the year 1999 - 2000—Communicated.

A Statement showing the inventory level to be maintained by the circles for the year 1999-2000, as approved by Chairman, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board is enclosed for strict adherence. Actual inventory level in the circles should be maintained well within the minimum level on below the level now fixed at any point of the time during the year 1999-2000.

2. It is seen from the inventory level so far maintained by the circles, that they have not shown due importance to the guidelines issued by this office to maintain the inventory level to the bearest minimum. The stocking of materials in the store-yard for imaginary use and disproportionate quantities has also been objected to by Reserve Bank of India and critically commented by Public Undertaking Committee in their reports. Excess inventory results in locking up of Boards' money and other associated costs such as interest cost inventory carrying cost, obsolescence cost etc.

3. In view of the tight financial conditions prevailing in the Board and also to improve the financial condition, the Superintending Engineers and Chief Engineers, are requested to ensure that all out efforts should be made to control the inventory to keep it within the prescribed level, by adopting four fold strategy (viz.),

- (i) to be more cost conscious in inventory management.
- (ii) by regulating the purchase orders and delivery schedules to suit the work schedule requirements, so that the inventory is kept for minimum period in stores. Wherever necessary the delivery schedules can be rescheduled after getting Competent Authority's approval. The concept of "Just in time" "JIT" in inventory management can be achieved over a period so that the inventory cost gets considerably reduced in Board.
- (iii) Scraps and empties must be disposed off then and there and money realised to Board's account without any delay. Action is to be insisted the diversion of non-moving and obsolete items to needy circle. In case they are not usable, action may be initiated to dispose these items after getting approval of competent authority.
- (iv) Periodical review and inspection of stores by Superintending Engineers/Chief Engineers and other inspecting officers to keep a watch over the inventory and to ensure the level within the limits prescribed.
- (v) In order to control and reduce inventory level, the circles Superintending Engineers must ensure that the receipts of stores and issues from stores are properly matched on a month to month basis and issues from stores to work must be more than the receipts of stores so that the inventory level can be reduced in phased manner.

4. The maximum inventory level should not exceed the limit prescribed for 1999-2000 under any circumstances and proposed on ratification of the excess stock held in the circles, will not be entertained.

2. Due to escalation in the cost of moped, the Government in their Government Order fourth cited, have revised the monetary limit for sanction of conveyance advance for the purchase of moped.

3. Following the orders of the Government, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board directs that the quantum of advance for purchase of "Moped" shall be enhanced as detailed below :-

Electricity—Violation in unmetered L.T. Services (Huts & Agriculture)—Resort to place the Service Connection under disconnection for a certain period in addition to compensation charges—Introducing New Clause 9.02 to Schedule Part-I of Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity—Orders issued.

Proceedings :

During an enquiry by the Vigilance Cell against free supply of power to one of the Agriculture Service Connections, it is revealed that the particular agriculture Service Connection was extended to a motor provided in a poromboke land at a distance of 600 metres and it was utilised for agricultural purposes. It was informed that the violation was noticed on several occasions and penal amounts were reported to be paid by the owner but the unlawful extension was repeated.

As of now there is no provision in the Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity for taking any stern action against such repeated violations in the case of unmetered services, it is proposed for introducing a new Clause 9.02 of 37 Schedule Part-I of Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity to resort to place the Service Connection under disconnection for a certain period in addition to compensation charges for repeated violations in unmetered LT Services (Hut & Agricultural Service Connection).

Accordingly, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 49 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948 (Central Act LIV of 1948), TNEB after careful consideration decides to include the following New Clause to Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity notified in B.P.Ms. (FB) No. 61 Dt. 24—12—88 and published in Part-VI, Section 3 (b) of Tamil Nadu Government Gazette No. 7, dated 21—2—96 and as amended subsequently.

The new Clause to Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity shall come into force with immediate effect.

Amendment

“9.02 :— If a Consumer of unmetered L.T. Service (e.g. Hut & Agriculture) commits a violation as per Clause 2.03 of Schedule Part—I with violation committed earlier within a period of five years from the date of detection of first violation, action will be taken as follows :

Violation	Action to be taken
1. For the second time within five years from first violation.	Supply will be kept disconnected for three months.
2. For the third time and for subsequent times within five years of first violation.	Supply will be kept disconnected for one year.

In addition, compensation charges for the violation shall be payable as per Clause 2.03 of this schedule”.

In the reference second cited, the Chief Engineer/Distribution/Trichy has reported that a certain consumer has applied for an agricultural load of 3 HP in 1987, when flat rate tariff was in existence for agricultural consumption and that, the above consumer after issue of 90 days notice has requested for change of well in another village, with increase in load to 20 HP now, when the agricultural supply is free of cost, under normal priority.

The Chief Engineer/Distribution/Trichy has requested for issue of instructions in this matter taking into consideration the fact that permitting abnormal enhancement of load at the notice stage amounts to abuse of existing infrastructure and to avoid misuse of power.

After careful consideration of all the aspects connected with the issue the following instructions are issued.

- (i) If any consumer under normal priority requests for change of well from the original location to a new location, then no increase in the load will be permitted, under normal priority.
- (ii) If the applicant, under normal priority requests for change of well from the original location to a new location with the increase in load then, he may be asked to avail supply under RSFS in the application stage itself.
- (iii) If the consumer does not agree for the above, shifting alone may be permitted for the original load if the required conditions for shifting are satisfied.

Electricity—LT assessment—Rounding off the assessment to the nearest ten units—Amendment to clause 19.04 of Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity—Orders issued.

Proceedings :

The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Accounts and Executive Staff Union (AESU) demanded that meter readings may be taken at the lower multiple of ten units instead of five units (which is the existing procedure) for easy calculation of current consumption charges in respect of LT. consumers.

The request of the union for rounding off the consumption to the nearest ten units is only to facilitate easy calculation by the Assessors and Billing Assistants and to save the working time.

The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board after careful consideration of the request of the union and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 49 of the Electricity (supply) Act, 1948 (Central Act LIV of 1948) issues the following amendment to the clause 19.04 of Terms and Conditions of supply of Electricity notified in B.P. Ms. (FB) No. 61 dated 24—12—88 and published in Part VI, Section 3(b) of Tamil Nadu Government Gazette No. 7 dated 21—2—96 and as amended subsequently.

The amendment shall come into force with immediate effect.

AMENDMENT

The clause 19.04 will read as below :—

“In the case of LT service connections (except in case of free supply) meter readings will be taken on alternate months. Meters of one group of service connections will be read from the 16th for a period of about ten working days during the first, third and fifth month etc. and the meters of the other group of service connections will be read from the 16th for a period of about ten working days during the second, fourth and sixth month, etc. The meter readings of last digit upto and inclusive of five units shall be rounded off to the lower multiple of ten units and the meter readings of last digit from six to nine units shall be rounded off to the higher multiple of ten units. After taking the meter readings, the particular of meter readings, energy consumption and charges payable will be incorporated in the white meter card available with the consumer”.

Proceedings :

Large scale representations by the High Tension Consumers for the extension of time for payment of current consumption charges has been engaging the attention of the Board for quite some time. After examining this issue especially with reference to the ways and means position of the Board, the Board has decided to delegate powers to the Superintending Engineers of Electricity Distribution Circles to grant extension of time to the deserving high tension/extra high tension Consumers to remit the current consumption charges beyond the last date stipulated for payment, in any case not beyond the twenty fifth day of the month in which the bill is due for payment, subject to the levy of Belated Payment Surcharge (BPSC) at 3% (three percent) per month for a full month, failing which the supply should be disconnected on the succeeding day.

Accordingly in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 49 of the Electricity (Supply) Act 1948 (Central Act LIV of 1948) the Board after careful consideration issues the following amendments to the Clauses 19.05, 20.02 and 20.06 of Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity notified in B.P. Ms. (FB) No.61 dt. 24-12-88 and published in Part-VI, Section 3(b) of Tamil Nadu Government Gazette No.7 dt. 21-2-96 and as amended subsequently.

B.B.—12 (July, '99)

The amendments shall come into force with immediate effect.

Amendments

- (1) The following sentences shall be added at the end of **first para** of Clause 19.05 :—

However the Consumer shall be allowed to make payment after the expiry of the 8 days period allowed for payment, but on or before 25th of the same calendar month on an application made to the Superintending Engineers of respective circles. On receipt of application, the Superintending Engineers of Electricity Distribution Circles may grant extension of time upto 25th of the respective due month subject to levy of BPSC at 3% per month from the expiry of 8 days period allowed for payment for a full month irrespective of number of days delayed. In this case, the disconnection shall be on the day following the extended due date for payment".

2. The following sentence shall be added at the end of Clause 20.02:-

"However, for the consumers who are availing extension of time beyond the 7 days notice period, as per Clause 19.05, the BPSC shall be at 3% per month from the expiry of the 8 days period allowed for payment for a full month irrespective of number of days delayed".

3. The following sentence shall be added at the end of Clause 20.06 :-

"However, for the Consumers who are availing extension of time beyond the 7 days notice period, as per Clause 19.05 the BPSC shall be at 3% per month from the expiry of the 8 days period allowed for payment, for a full month irrespective of number of days delayed".
