Sub: Observance of National Energy Security Day on 18th August, 2020

Dear Sir,

We, on behalf of National Co-ordination Committee of Electricity Employees & Engineers (NCCOEEE); the broad based united platform of all the National Federations of Electricity Employees and Engineers functional in the national plain since two decades last, like to draw your contemplative attention on the captioned subject.

We like to reiterate the points we referred to you on 29th June, 2020 quoting NITI project report titled 'Energizing India' in association with Institute for Energy Economics, Japan (IEEJ) in June, 2017. Wherein we clearly indicated the energy scenario of our country at present and projection of experts in the future is grim. From that point of view decision of your government will jeopardize the Energy Security of the country. In order to draw your attention, all NCCOEEE constituents will observe **National Energy Security Day on 18th August, 2020** through protest meetings and demonstration all over the country.

In addition to above points, we like to draw your attention to the global trend to energy security of developed countries referring to **primary energy consumption between 2007 and 2017**. As par World Energy Council, **in 2007 USA, UK & India consumed primary energy in mToE 2320.8, 223.1 & 450.4 respectively. In 2017 figures were 2234.9, 191.3 & 757.7 respectively**. Next, we like to quote WEC statistics for consumption of coal of all those countries in mToE for 2016 and 2017. **First year figures were 340.6, 11.2 & 405.6 and second year 332.1, 9.0 & 424.0 respectively**. Due to improvement of energy efficiency of developed countries, total primary energy and coal consumption is in lower trend, where as we have not achieved our target since Energy Conservation Act was legislated in 2001 in our country. Dependence of our country on coal as primary source of energy is increasing. As par NITI study the coal dependence will further increase by three decades next. **Key observation of the NITI report is that coal is going to remain the**

mainstay of India's future energy mix with a share of 42% in Business As Usual to 50% in ambitious scenario.

In this situation, Government is planning to adopt following steps:

- Privatisation of Electricity distribution in states and Union Territories
- Privatisation of Coal mining and transfer of other natural energy resources to private hands.
- Privatisation of Railways
- Privatisation of BSNL
- Privatisation of Defense Production
- Privatisation of all important Public sector enterprises

NCCOEE constituents will observe **National Energy Security Day on 18th August, 2020** in all electricity utilities to solicit your intervention over the following points of concern with the expectation that your government will keep its commitment before the countrymen.

1. Scrap Electricity (Amendment), Bill 2020 drafted towards privatisation of electricity distribution contrary to the Federal structure of the country.
2. Stop privatisation of all natural resources of the country including commercial mining of coal to ensure energy security of the country.
3. Stop privatisation of Railways in any form to ensure self-reliance in public transportation.
4. Stop privatisation of BSNL, through planned attempt of curbing its efficiency to ensure self-reliance in communication.
5. Stop privatisation Defense Production to keep the sovereignty of India.
6. Stop privatisation of all important Public sector enterprises to keep self-reliance of the country earned through 74 years since 15th August, 1947.

We, on behalf of all the electricity Workers, Employees & Engineers of India, convey sincerest thanks to you.


